

### **Andrew Georg**

Andrew Georg is a versatile South Australian musician whose career encompasses church music, opera and musical theatre, choral music, and accompanying. Since 2010 Andrew has been a Répétiteur for the State Opera of South Australia, where he has worked on a diverse range of operas, including several Australian and world premieres. He has also worked with Co-Opera and the Adelaide Festival on operatic productions.

After completing studies at the Elder Conservatorium, Andrew was an Organ Scholar at St Peter's Cathedral and Pilgrim Church. In 2013 Andrew took up the position of Organist and Choir Director at Christ Church North Adelaide. In 2014 Andrew won the Geoffrey Parsons' Award for accompanying, Australia's most prestigious award for the collaborative pianist.

### Adelaide Cantata Band

Formed in 2017, Adelaide's newest period-instrument ensemble specialises in the performance of choral/instrumental works of the Baroque era, with a particular emphasis on the works of J.S Bach. The Adelaide Cantata Band's inaugural performance in late 2017 included Bach's secular cantata BWV 211, nicknamed the "Coffee Cantata", and further performances are planned for later in 2018.

### Kim Worley - Guest Director

Conductor, cellist and singer Kim Worley leads a very active musical life, sharing his time between teaching, performing, directing, and his postgraduate studies in conducting. Having returned with his family to Adelaide in 2017 after a five-year period of studying and working in Melbourne, Kim has begun to establish himself in the Adelaide music scene, performing in public concerts, working as chorus master for the Elder Conservatorium/State Opera of South Australia co-production of Donizetti's Don Pasquale, and directing a highly successful performance of Mozart's Requiem in D minor for Big Sing McLaren Vale, with orchestra and massed choir. In this time, Kim has also appeared in concert across Australia and New Zealand, performing as part of the Darwin Symphony Orchestra, as a chamber musician for the Lyrebird Music Society's concert series in Melbourne and singing excerpts of the Evangelist in J.S. Bach's St Matthew Passion in Nelson, New Zealand.

As part of his conducting studies, Kim has worked with the Elder New Music Ensemble and the Elder Conservatorium Symphony Orchestra, as well as conducting the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra in workshops with Luke Dollman and Nicholas Carter,

Having sung in choirs from an early age and performed with notable groups such as the Adelaide Chamber Singers, Consort of Melbourne, Gloriana Chamber Choir and Ensemble Gombert, Kim has a rich and varied store of experience to draw upon when working with the Kapelle Singers. Previous choral conducting engagements have been with the choirs of Pilgrim Uniting Church, Adelaide and St David's Anglican Church, Burnside.

### Notes from the director Kim Worley

Welcome to Bach Connections, the first concert in The Kapelle Singers' 2018 concert series. Bach Connections explores music by the great Baroque master, J.S. Bach, and his German predecessors and successors. For this performance the choir will be joined by the Adelaide Cantata Band in presenting Bach's cantata BWV 150 "Nach dir, Herr, verlanget mich", as well as motets by Bach and Heinrich Schütz.

This is the second time I have had the pleasure of working with Kapelle, an enthusiastic and skilled group of musicians, and over the rehearsal period for this concert they have risen to the challenge of learning this beautiful but often complex repertoire in a committed and whole-hearted way. I am sincerely grateful to each and every member of the choir for their part in this journey, and thank them for the hard work, dedication and "can do" attitude they have brought to preparing the music you will hear today.

The works in today's program are quite varied in style and affect but, as the concert title suggests, they all have a link to J.S. Bach. Heinrich Schütz and Hans Leo Hassler were important musical figures in the region of current-day Germany and their music is representative of the style which immediately preceded Bach. Johannes Brahms' music both hearkens back to Bach and looks forward to the harmonic innovation and complexity in music of the 20th century, and Knut Nysted pays homage to this colossal figure of Western Art music in his own very distinctive way.

A big vote of thanks must be given to Glenys March for generously providing her harpsichord for today's concert; to Andrew Georg for not only his superbly sensitive keyboard playing but also his very welcome musical input in rehearsals; and to Carol Fort, Astrid Lane and the entire Kapelle Singers committee for their time and energy in enabling such a concert to take place.

I encourage you to sit back, relax, and let the Kapelle Singers and the Adelaide Cantata Band take you on a wonderful journey through fine music in Bach Connections.
